SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding pupils in our school is a priority. Therefore, I wish to update you on a new initiative our school supports: the Uniform Intelligence Hub. The Hub's purpose is to help identify and locate vulnerable children who are subject to online abuse. The Uniform Intelligence Hub is funded by the Home Office and supported by the Safeguarding Minister, Jess Phillips.

Local Police forces are requesting the support of schools to upload images of school uniforms/school logos, etc, that will be stored centrally in the Uniform Intelligence Hub. This will help to speed up the search process so children and young people are identified and safeguarded more quickly.

No school child will be identified in this process, as Camera Forensics will securely edit all images uploaded to the school's individual portal; this is about identifying the uniform only.



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Talk to your children about Water Safety!

Flooding and ice in winter can be dangerous for children. Keep your children safe and talk to them about water safety.



STAY AWAY FROM THE EDGE



- Keep back from slippery banks.
- Never walk or play on ice.
- Stick to well-lit areas and plan your walks during daylight.
- Avoid walking or driving through floodwater.

IF YOU FALL THROUGH THE ICE



- Keep calm and call for help.
- Float on your back until you feel calm, then try to climb out.
- If you cannot climb out, continue to float and keep your head clear of the water.
